

**PROPOSED MINUTES
PRESBYTERY OF MACKINAC

Saturday, May 18, 2019**

1 The Presbytery of Mackinac held a Stated meeting Saturday, May 18, 2019. Presbytery Moderator, the Rev. Dr. William Myers, called the meeting to order and opened with prayer at 10:00 a.m. at The Presbyterian Church of Traverse City, Michigan.

1.1 The roll was taken, and the Moderator ascertained that a quorum was present. In accordance with the *Book of Order*, G-3.0304, a quorum is defined as being “no fewer than three teaching elders who are members of presbytery and three ruling elder commissioners from three different congregations.”

- 1.2 The Rev. Dr. William Myers, Pastor of The Presbyterian Church of Traverse City, Michigan, welcomed the members and visitors of the Presbytery of Mackinac.
- 1.3 First-time ruling elder commissioners and pastors new to the Presbytery were introduced and welcomed.
- 1.4 On motion duly made and seconded, Presbytery **VOTED** to seat Corresponding Members.
- 1.5 On motion duly made and seconded, Presbytery **VOTED** to give Corresponding Members voice but not vote.

2 ADOPTION OF THE MINUTES

On motion duly made and seconded, Presbytery **VOTED** to approve the minutes and all of its appendices of the February 23, 2019, meeting of the Presbytery of Mackinac as the official record.

3 APPROVAL OF THE CONSENT AGENDA AND DOCKET

3.1 Consent Agenda

- 3.1.1 Recipient for today’s offering went to *Remain in Touch*, a non profit literacy program in the Traverse City area that offers incarcerated parents the opportunity to select free books and record them aloud for their

children, ages 1-12 years. The recordings and books are sent to the individual children, allowing the parents to stay connected and bridge the gap that exists during the time of their incarceration.

- 3.1.4 The following items were on the Consent Agenda of the February 23, 2019 Presbytery meeting. However, a question was raised regarding the Consent Agenda's approval, so they are being included at this meeting for approval.

3.1.4.1 **Action Item 1: Begin Presbytery of Mackinac Meetings in unison praying the following:**

“Gracious God, by the prompting of the Holy Spirit and by following the way of Christ, we offer ourselves to you. In order to lead and serve our Presbytery, help us to function with energy, enthusiasm, honesty and transparency, seeking to leave our personal agendas in your hands. May we honor each person's presence and perspective, listening fervently and seeking the good of the whole. Almighty God, because you have loved us and respected us first, allow us to love and respect one another. As we nurture our individual lives, help us to pray daily for each other, honoring the life we make in you. Through Christ, we pray. Amen”

3.1.4.2 **Action Item 2: Adopt the following:**

“Holy Manners Covenant of the Presbytery of Mackinac

“Being a member of the Presbytery of Mackinac I pledge that I will endeavor to follow the example of our Lord Jesus Christ and love the Lord God with all my heart, mind and soul and love my neighbor as Jesus loves me. Further, I will pray regularly for the Presbytery, other members of the Presbytery and Presbytery staff and leadership. During Presbytery Meetings I will treat everyone as I want to be treated, showing respect for them and their opinions. When the Presbytery has made a decision, I will abide by and support that decision whether I had previously supported it or not. Through all of my efforts on behalf of the Presbytery, my church and in my life, I will seek to continue conscious contact with the Holy Spirit. I realize that we each are a part of the Body of Christ and have a part to play in our efforts to love and serve the Lord.”

“Background for above Actions: In the past, some members of our Presbytery believed we acted in a less than Christ like fashion at our Council and Presbytery meetings. They felt so strongly about this that they wrote letters to the Synod of the Covenant, a factor in leading to the Synod appointing the Administrative Commission in August of 2017. That Commission prepared and submitted a Report to the Synod in August of 2018. The Report as adopted includes requirements and recommendations for our Presbytery.

Knowing what the final Report of the Commission was going to include and realizing we needed to address our member's concerns, in May of 2018 your Coordinating Council held a retreat prior to the Presbytery Meeting. As a result of that Retreat, during which we brainstormed, a committee volunteered to take all our ideas and present a Holy Manners

Covenant for the Coordinating Council at the Council's next meeting. This led to the presentation and adoption of a full page covenant. This year's Council reviewed and adopted the Holy Manners Covenant with a one word change and determined that a condensed version should be presented for adoption by the Presbytery to meet the concerns of our members, comply with Item 1a of the Administrative Commission's Report and follow the example of Jesus in our interactions before, during and after meetings."

- 3.2 Two items were removed from the Consent Agenda: 2018 Statistical Report which was included in the Stated Clerk's report and the report of the Presbytery's Commissioners to Synod Assembly.
- 3.3 On the Docket, the report of the Committee on Ministry will follow Worship.
- 3.4 There being no more changes to the Consent Agenda or the Docket, on motion duly made and seconded, Presbytery **VOTED** to approve the items on the Consent Agenda and to approve the Docket.

4 **THE BODY OF CHRIST UNITES IN WORSHIP AND THE SACRAMENT OF THE LORD'S SUPPER**

The Rev. Dr. William Myers, pastor at The Presbyterian Church of Traverse City, Proclaimed the Word of God and officiated at The Lord's Supper.

5 **COMMITTEE ON MINISTRY**

- 5.1 In addition to the written report (APPENDIX C) submitted by the Committee on Ministry, the Committee Chair, Ruling Elder Susanne Fantini reported as follows:
- 5.2 The Administrative Commission for the Installation of Rev. D. Ian Machines-Green was held May 5, 2019, at First Presbyterian Church of Gaylord. Members of the Commission were Ruling Elders Susanne Fantini (Petoskey, First) and Judy Penney (Gaylord, First); and Rev. Dr. Donald Kinloch (Honorably Retired) and Rev. Elliot Morrison, Moderator (Honorably Retired).
- 5.3 The Installation of Rev. Peter Norland was held May 5, 2019, at Portage Lake Community Church of Houghton, (a Union church—Presbyterian and United Church of Christ). Presiding were Rev. Rob MacDougall, Associate Conference Minister, Wisconsin Conference of the United Church of Christ; Rev. Steve Russell, Wisconsin Conference, United Church of Christ; and Ruling Elder George Carnahan (Marquette, First), Presbytery of Mackinac.
- 5.4 Committee on Ministry approved (April 11, 2019) Lauren March as an Inquirer. She is a member of First Presbyterian Church of Kingsford/Iron Mountain and was endorsed by the Session on April 9, 2019.
- 5.5 Temporary pastoral support for The Presbyterian Church of Traverse City during the time of transition at The Presbyterian Church of Traverse City. The approved list includes one elder ordained in a congregational church, two clergy, and nine PC(USA) elders. Wayne Swallow will only be

invited to preach and be paired with a pastor or PC(USA) elder when communion is celebrated. The 11 individuals will preach and serve communion for the neXus and/or traditional worship: LuEllen Baty (Session 1), Nancy Briggs (Session 1), Rick Cooper (Session 1), Mike Eldredge (Session 1), Barbara Morrison, Elliot Morrison (PCUSA Clergy), Wayne Swallow, Dick Teubert (Session 1), Art Van Eck (Clergy), John Waechter (Fall-Session 1), Kris Wendland.

As part of the preparatory process, each of the elders will attend two sessions, conversations on the theology and meaning of “Worship, Preaching, and The Lord’s Supper” and “Putting It All Together” preparing for and presiding over worship). As part of these sessions, Rev. Dr. William Myers is introducing the participants to the *Book of Order*, *Directory for Worship* and *The Book of Common Worship*. Additional support will be offered as needed.

5.6 The Presbytery **VOTED** to approve the actions reported by the Committee on Ministry.

6 **PRESBYTERY MODERATOR**

Presbytery Moderator, the Rev. Dr. William Myers, reported verbally.

7 **STATED CLERK**

Stated Clerk, Ruling Elder Kay Morrill, reported.

7.1 **Action Items for Presbytery**

7.1.1 On motion duly made and seconded, Presbytery **VOTED** to adopt the **2018 Presbytery Statistical Report** which is a compilation of statistics reported to the Office of the General Assembly from the churches in the Presbytery of Mackinac. Rudyard and Trout Creek were non compliant. APPENDIX D

The Presbytery showed an overall loss of 317 members in 2018 compared to a loss of 260 in 2017. At least one-third of the overall loss in 2018 was due to Sessions purging their churches membership rolls. The Presbytery has applied for a reduction in per capita for 2018 from OGA for the loss of 317 members.

7.1.2 On motion duly made and seconded, Presbytery **VOTED** to approve the 2019 Terms of Call retroactive to January 1, 2019. APPENDIX E

7.2.2 **223rd General Assembly (2018) Proposed Amendments**

All but one of the constitutional amendments proposed by the 223rd General Assembly (2018) of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) have received the 86 affirmative votes needed for ratification from among the 170 presbyteries.

Proposed Amendment 18-C On Amending G-3.0104 was defeated by almost a 3 to 1 margin.

Shall G-3.0104 of the Form of Government be amended by adding the following statement as the last paragraph to read as follows? [Text to be added is shown as italic.]

“No congregation, session, presbytery, synod, or national office of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), nor any individual acting on behalf of or in an official capacity for the above institutions, shall publicly endorse or oppose, or otherwise encourage or discourage others to vote for or against an individual running for public office.” This Proposed Amendment was defeated.

The new provisions will take effect on June 23, 2019—one year from the adjournment of the Assembly that proposed them and will be included in the *2019-2021 Book of Order* (G-6.04e).

7.2.3 **Annual Gathering and Synod Review**

The Stated Clerk attended the Annual Administrative Review and meeting of the Presbytery Stated Clerks at the Synod of the Covenant Office in Maumee, Ohio, on April 29 and 30, 2019. The Presbytery received two exceptions: The audit or financial review for 2017 was not completed and adopted in 2018, and there were no descriptions for property sold or mortgaged.

The Presbytery Stated Clerks met with the Rules of Discipline Task Force Chair, Rev. Paige McRight. The Task Force, formed following the 223rd General Assembly (2016), was called and “charged with revising the entire Rules of Discipline; make the Rules of Discipline more accessible to the church; preserve and enhance the accountability of councils and individuals to the church; expand the role of mediation and alternate dispute resolution; provide flexibility in crafting censures and remedies, particularly in light of recent learnings in ethical and social development and experiments by the secular legal system with alternative sentencing.” The Task Force is currently accepting feedback and suggestions for changes at pmcright@cfl.rr.com. The Task Force’s final report will be presented to the 224th General Assembly (2020) in Baltimore. If approved by the General Assembly and presbyteries, the portion of the *Book of Order* known as the “Rules of Discipline” will become “Church Discipline.”

8 **TREASURER’S REPORT**

Treasurer, Ruling Elder John Fought, submitted a written Comparative Financial Summary for January 1 through April 30, 2019, (APPENDIX F) and reported verbally.

9 **COMMITTEE ON BUDGET AND FINANCIAL SERVICES**

Rev. Dr. Anne Hebert, chair of the Committee on Budget and Financial Services, reported verbally.

9.1 **Action Items**

9.1.1 On recommendation of the Committee on Budget and Financial Services, the Presbytery **VOTED** to receive the Independent Auditor’s Report from Schulze, Oswald, Miller, and Edwards PC, Certified Public Accountants; the Balance Sheet–All Funds Statement for the Presbytery; Auditors’ Notes 1) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, 2) Insurance, 3) Concentration of Credit Risk, 4) Subsequent Events; Communication of Significant Deficiencies and Material Weaknesses; Communication with Those Charged with Governance at the Conclusion of the Audit, all for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2017. APPENDIX G

9.1.2 At the request of the congregation of First Presbyterian Church of Rudyard and on recommendation of the Committee on Budget and Financial Services, the Presbytery of Mackinac **VOTED** to approve the request of the congregation of First Presbyterian Church of Rudyard to “donate the property given to the church by Roger Beacon to Superior Health Support Systems for the purpose of building, managing, and maintaining a five (5) bed Assisted Living Center/one (1) bed Hospice House.”

The Legal Description of the property being donated to Superior Health Support Systems is the following:

Land situated in the Township of Rudyard, County of Chippewa, Michigan.

Parcel A: Lot 10, Fair Dor Heights Plat, according to the plat recorded in Liber 8, page 17, Chippewa County Records.

Parcel B: Part of the Northwest 1/4 of the Northwest 1/4, Section 8, Town 44 North, Range West, more particularly described as commencing at the Northwest corner of said Northwest 1/4 of the Northwest 1/4; thence South 03°30' West 75 feet; thence South 86°30' East 235.83 feet to the point of beginning; thence South 86°30' East 125.84 feet; thence South 03°30' West 234 feet; thence North 86°30' West 261.67 feet; thence North 03°30' East 84 feet; thence North 45° East 175 feet to the place of beginning.

come in. On motion duly made and seconded, Presbytery **VOTED** to authorize the Coordinating Council to act on any loan application to borrow not more than \$75,000 from the Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program for the procurement of a pipe organ for St. Andrews Presbyterian Church of Beulah.

Presbytery Moderator, the Rev. Dr. William Myers, offered motions on behalf of the Committee Chair, Rev, David Henderson, Honorably Retired, in his absence.

10.1 There being no nominations from the floor, Presbytery **VOTED** to elect the Rev. Ryan Donahoe Chair of the Committee on Personnel effective immediately. He currently serves on the Committee on Personnel, Class of 2021.

10.2 There being no nominations from the floor, Presbytery **VOTED** to elect Commissioned Lay Pastor, Dawn Robbins, Chair of the Committee on Worshiping Communities effective immediately. She currently serves on the Committee on Worshiping Communities, Class of 2020.

10.3 There being no nominations from the floor, Presbytery **VOTED** to elect the Rev. Dr. Kenneth P. Murphy Chair of the Committee on Education and Leadership Development effective immediately. He currently serves on the Committee on Education and Leadership Development, Class of 2021.

11 Presbytery Moderator, Rev. Dr. William Myers, relinquished the Chair to Vice Moderator, Ruling Elder William Clark at 11:40 a.m.
